

01 Kanshinji Temple

観心寺

A large established in 701 by the Ujiguchi, the founder of Shugendō (Shamanism, mountain asceticism), and later used as a Shōgun's seat (stronghold) by the latter Kōshō-ryū family. Famous for being a place of study for Saichō, founder of Tendai Shū, the Nichiren-kyō Period (13th century). National Treasure, Golden Hall, Statue of Shōgun Yoritomo Tsunayoshi, Golden Hall, Statue of Shōgun Yoritomo Tsunayoshi. Every April 17, 18.

02 Enmeiji Temple

延命寺

This temple was established in 810-824 when Kūkai created a stone image of a Jizo and it became the principal image of the temple. The temple's massive ancient "Gompei Maple" tree, which is famous for its red leaves and said to be 1,000 years old, has been designated a Natural Monument by Osaka Prefecture. Important Cultural Properties: Wooden Statue of Standing Shōgun Nyōze.

Directions: Get on the Hankai Bus at Minatoguchi Station on the Hankai Line, and get off at Enmeiji Temple. Walk about 10 min.

03 Amanosan Kongoji Temple

天野山金剛寺

This temple is said to have been established by Quiki at the order of Emperor Shōmu in the Nara Period. It is also said that Kūkai practiced esoteric Buddhism here. As the temple was open to women, it is also known by the name Nyūjin Kōya (Mt. Kōya for women). Amano-Ōyū.

Directions: From Kawachinagano Station, take the Hankai Bus toward Sakai and get off at Amanosan. Walk about 10 min.

04 Eboshigata Hachiman Shrine

At Mt. Eboshigata there was a castle known as Eboshigata Castle that was one of the Kawai (Kawai) Seven Castles, and this shrine is said to have been built to guard the castle. It is located on the eastern slope of Mt. Eboshigata, and the main hall has been designated an Important Cultural Property. The area that includes the shrine is the eastern part, and this historical area has been designated a Cultural Property by the national government.

Directions: From Kawachinagano Station, take the Hankai Bus toward Sakai and get off at Eboshigata. Walk about 10 min.

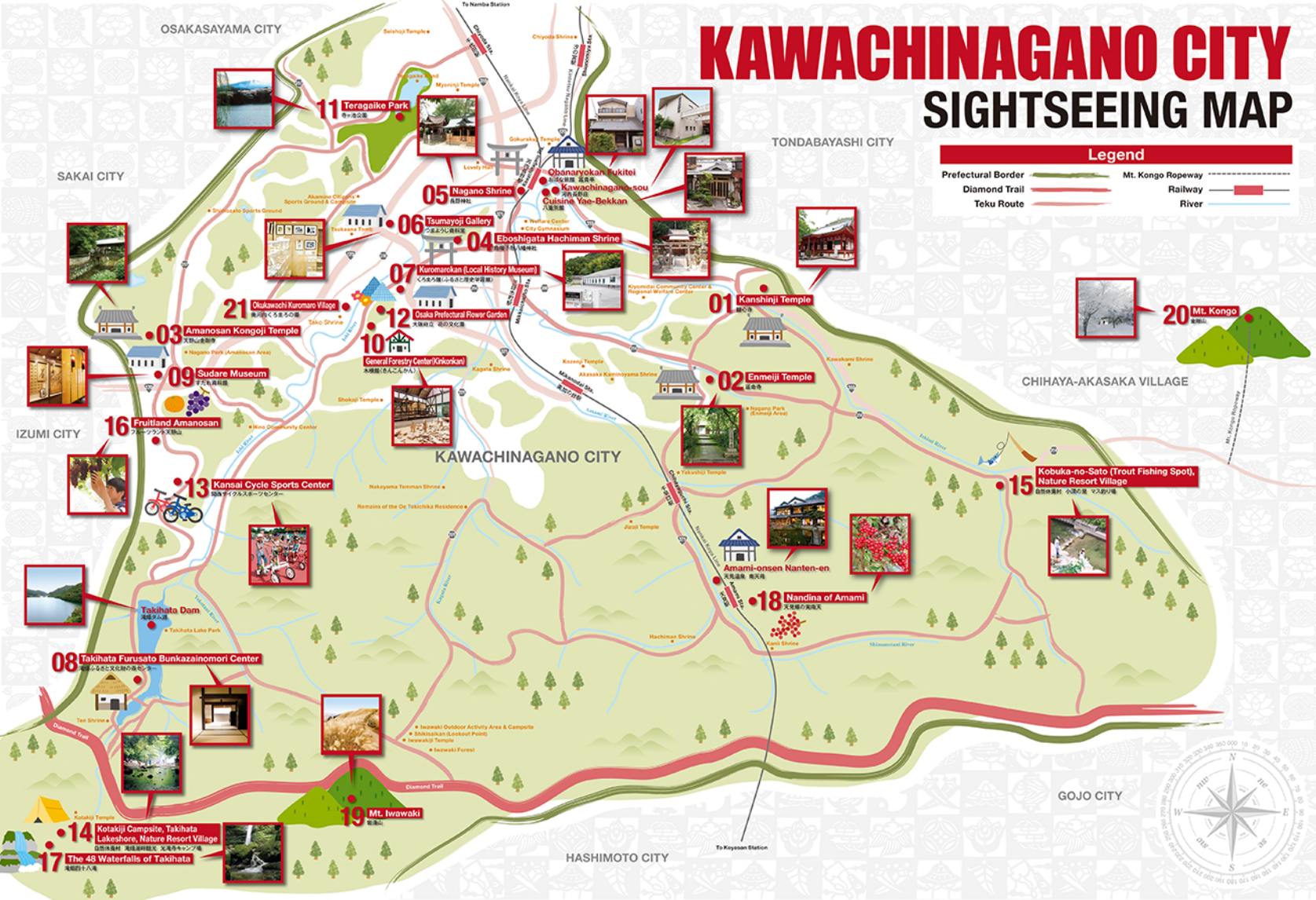
21 Okukawachi Kuromaro Village

18 Nandina of Amami

天児郷の実南天

Nandina (also known as sacred bamboo), which originated in China, is an evergreen shrub in the bamboo family that grows in the wild in the forested areas with deep surface soil west of the Kansai region. In Kawachinagano, it is often found cultivated around homes, in stone walls, and in fields, growing ground the Kōryū and Higashinagano districts. Nandina flowers from June to July, and bears bright red seeds around December. These can be used as cut flowers for Japanese traditional New Year's celebrations or for medicinal purposes.

Directions: From Kawachinagano Station, board the Hankai Bus toward Sakai and get off at Nandina of Amami. Walk about 10 min.
